TALKS

<u>Talk Report:</u> Tuesday 16th April "Dispelling 10 Myths About Peonies" Alec White.

Alec - the co-owner of Primrose Hall nursery - began his talk by explaining how, without formal horticultural training, over a 20 year period peonies became for him both a passion and a successful business. Stemming from a chance sighting of one of these exotic beauties standing out from a crowd of normal nursery plants, he has developed a business based on growing 60,000 peony plants representing 400 varieties at any one time! Each year Primrose Hall also ships more than 400 tons of peonies to growers!

So: "Are they hard to grow?" No provided you buy plants at least 5 years old and don't plant them too deeply in almost any soil that isn't too wet! Just a few cm below the surface and avoid mulching the crown!

"Are they delicate?" No! They can tolerate temperatures down to -25°C and peony seeds can survive for decades! Some cultivars can live and flower for more than a 100 years!

"Are they hard to move?" Not if you do it in October or November and replant the same day!

They can also be fragrant and, though they like sunny spots, some cultivars tolerate partial shade perfectly well! Different varieties can be in flower from April to July and ants don't bother them, though they do enjoy the sugary sap that peonies produce!

Definitely a plant worth persevering with and enjoying!

RHS Gardening in May

Summer is on its way!

As bulbs fade and herbaceous borders grow in leaps and bounds, it is now clear that summer is approaching. Sowing and planting out bedding can begin, depending on regional weather variations, and you can take softwood cuttings. It's also time to get back into the lawn mowing regime, as the lawn will be loving the warmer temperatures this month brings

Top gardening jobs this month:-

1. Watch out for late frosts. Protect tender plants

- 2. Earth up potatoes, and promptly plant any still remaining
- 3. Plant out summer bedding at the end of the month (except in cold areas)
- 4. Water early and late to get the most out of your water, recycle water when possible
- 5. Regularly hoe off weeds
- 6. Open greenhouse vents and doors on warm days
- 7. Mow lawns weekly but consider leaving some areas uncut for wildlife
- 8. Check for nesting birds before clipping hedges
- 9. Lift and divide overcrowded clumps of daffodils and other spring-flowering bulb
- Watch out for viburnum beetle and lily beetle grubs
